Winnetka Attorney Shot While Serving Writ

Richard M. C. Miller, 304 Ridge avenue, Winnetka, was shot in the left leg by the irate proprietor of a roadhouse when he was superintending the removal of furniture to satisfy an execution last Saturday. Attorney Miller had accompanied Constables P. J. Schildgen of Wilmette and Leo J. Meyers of Glenview to the Elk Grove inn at Higgins road and York street, Elk Grove township, to serve a writ of attachment on furnishings of the inn. As they were removing a piano and a cash register Andrew Grom, one of the proprietors of the place, appeared and fired at Miller with a shotgun, hitting him in the left leg above the knee. Miller was taken to the Evanston hospital by the two constables and Grom was later arrested by county highway police under Lieut. L. J. Laird. Miller was not seriously injured and is now recovering at his home.
