The house is of French architectural design, with nine rooms, three baths, sun room sleeping porch, and also a large open porch. A mottled brick, with buff predominating, is to be used, with a roof of slate. All walls are to be insulated with the new thermofill. There will be a two-car brick garage.

The plans, throughout, are designed for the most pleasing effect in the development of this beautiful corner, with a frontage of 100 feet on Chestnut, and in keeping with the high grade homes which adorn Chestnut, from one end to the other.

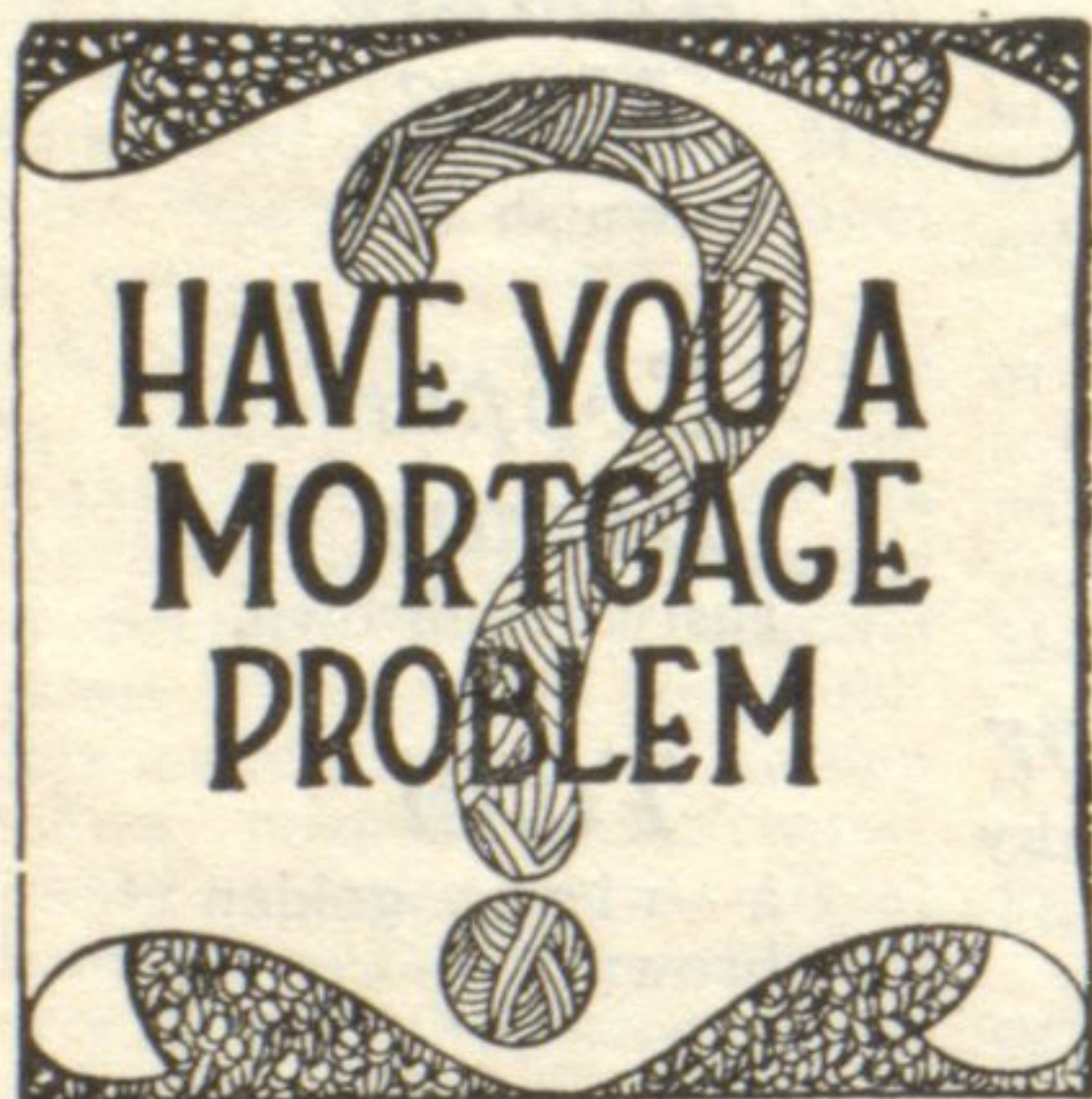
