The Eighteenth company has maintained an organization and several times a year, as many as can, assemble to renew friendships. Myron E. Adams who was morale officer of the camp, is an honorary member of the company.

Last Sunday twelve members of the company, some with their wives, attended the morning worship of the Winnetka Congregational church, and afterwards drove up to Ft. Sheridan, where they ate lunch together (all agreeing that army mess has greatly improved since 1917) and then walked around over the grounds, renewing memories of nine years ago.

They found the trenches they had helped dig, partly caved in and overgrown with weeds and underbrush, and most of the barracks torn down. But in the Citizens' Military Training camp there were signs of activity and order.

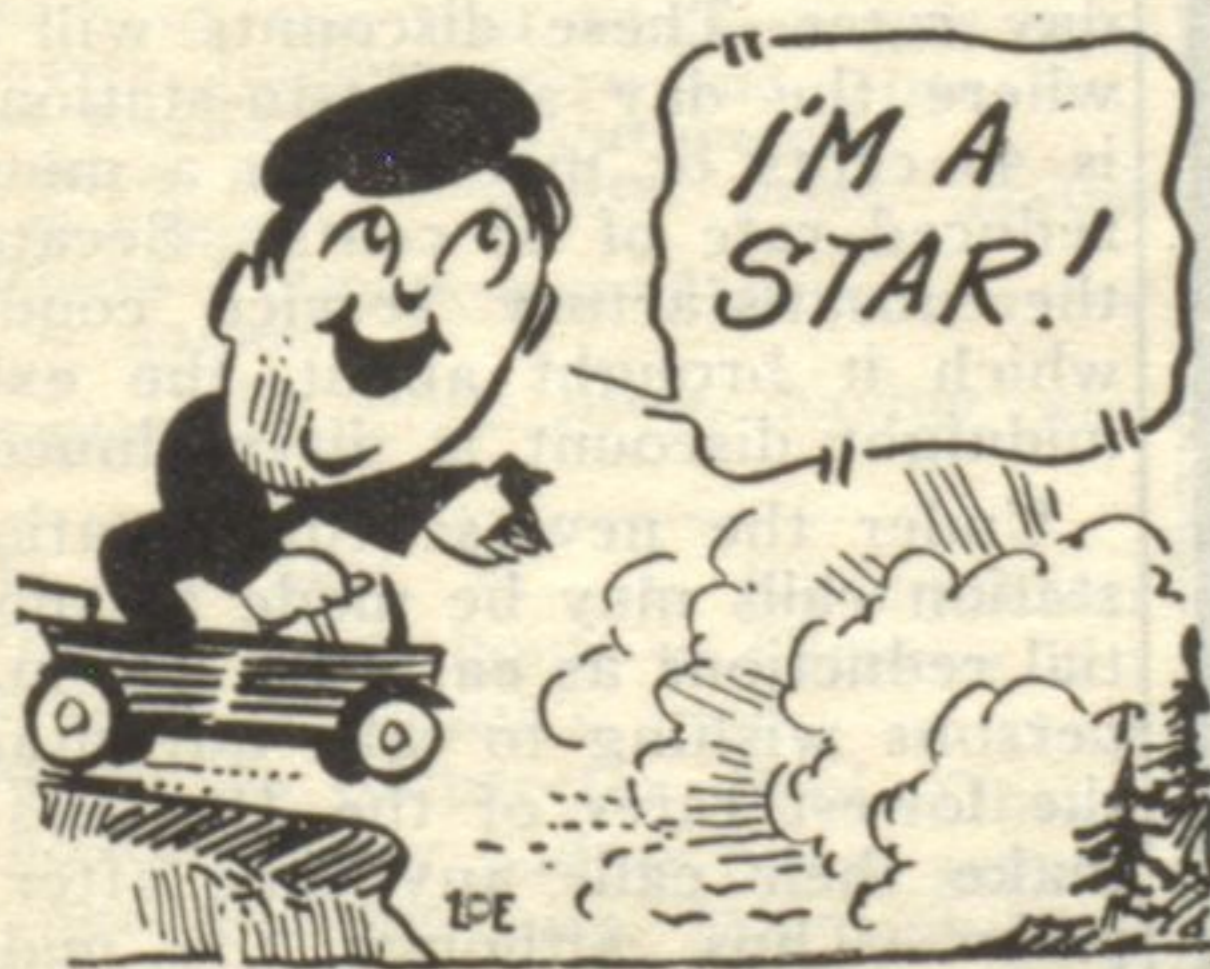
