

Alpheus D. Burgess of Hubbard Woods Taken by Death

Alpheus D. Burgess, 239 Scott avenue, for several years a resident of Hubbard Woods, died Saturday, August 21, after an illness of several months. He is survived by his widow, Lena C. Burgess, a daughter, Raine, 1105 Lake avenue, Wilmette, and a sister, Mrs. William E. Staples of New York City.

Born in New Haven, Conn., Mr. Burgess became engaged in the fur business, which had been carried on in his family as far back as the Revolutionary war. His father and uncle, known as Burgess and Burgess, were established as Furriers and Hatters in New Haven for thirty-five years.

Mr. Burgess was associated with John P. Shayne and company, for fourteen years, later establishing his own business at 29 East Madison street, Chicago.

He was a 32nd degree Mason, belonging to the Winnetka lodge, A. F. and A. M. and a member of the Illinois Athletic club. Masonic services were held at Graceland in the conservatory chapel. The remains have been sent to Evergreen cemetery in New Haven, Conn.
