CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Christ Jesus" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday, August 29.

The golden Text was from I John 4:14, "We have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world."

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch. Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly. Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me. If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not. But if I do, though ye believe not me, believe the works; that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him" (John 10:23-25, 37, 38).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Jesus represented Christ, the true idea of God . . . Christ presents the indestructible man, whom Spirit creates, constitute and governs. Christ illustrates that blending with God, his divine Principle, which gives man dominion over all the earth" (p. 316).
