North Shore Line Has Fastest Electric Train

The fastest electric railroad train in the United States is the Northland Limited, running between Chicago and Milwaukee, according to a survey made by Electric Traction. This train, operated by the Chicago, North Shore and Milwaukee railroad over its new Skokie Valley route, covers the 88.24 miles in two hours, making 9 stops en route. This train averages 44.12 miles per hour, including stops, or 51.91 miles per hour, not including stops.
