# TYPHOID FEVER TAKES BIG JUMP IN ILLINOIS

State Director of Health Declares
September Is Most Dangerous
Month for Disease

With typhoid fever twice as prevalent now as it was a month ago and six times more widespread than in May, Dr. Isaac D. Rawlings, state health director, points out in a bulletin issued this week that September is the most dangerous season of the year so far as this disease is concerned. Infection contracted in September almost invariably raise the number of October case reports to the highest annual peak. Last week sixty-three cases were reported, the highest weekly incidence so far this year.

"Slightly more than 200 cases of typhoid fever were reported in August against 106 in July" said Dr. Rawlings. "These figures contrast sharply with thirty-four for May and sixty-five for June. Each new case that develops increases the possibility of spreading the disease a hundred fold.

"September is distinctly the month

of greatest danger from typhoid fever. Carriers of the typhoid germs and ambulatory patients with mild attacks have traveled far and wide during the summer that has just past. Infected matter has found its way intowater and milk supplies at various points. The germs are more widely distributed than at any other time of year and therefore offer more opportunities for infection.

"Community gatherings are usually more frequent in September than they have been during the hotter months. If food is served on these occasions, the typhoid carrier, usually ignorant of his or her condition, who participates in preparing or serving the food gets in his deadly work. One community supper last year was followed by twenty-five cases of typhoid fever because a careless carrier prepared the


