which will bring Tito Schipa, premier lyric tenor of the Chicago Civic Opera company, on November 8.

Schipa is so well known to most north shore patrons of music that comment upon his brilliant career would seem almost superfluous. A brief summary of his marvelous achievements is, however, not amiss at this time.

Schipa was born in Lecce, Italy, and was destined to enter the priesthood at the earnest behest of his parents. But at an early age he broke away from his religious studies and entered the conservatory at Lecce for piano study. He became an accomplished musician and composer before his voice matured, after which he took up singing in the same institution. He made his debut in "La Traviata" in southern Italy.

From that juncture he experienced a rapid rise to fame as a singer in his native land and other European countries. His voice and composition won him great distinction in Spain and he was decorated for his great art by the king of Spain.

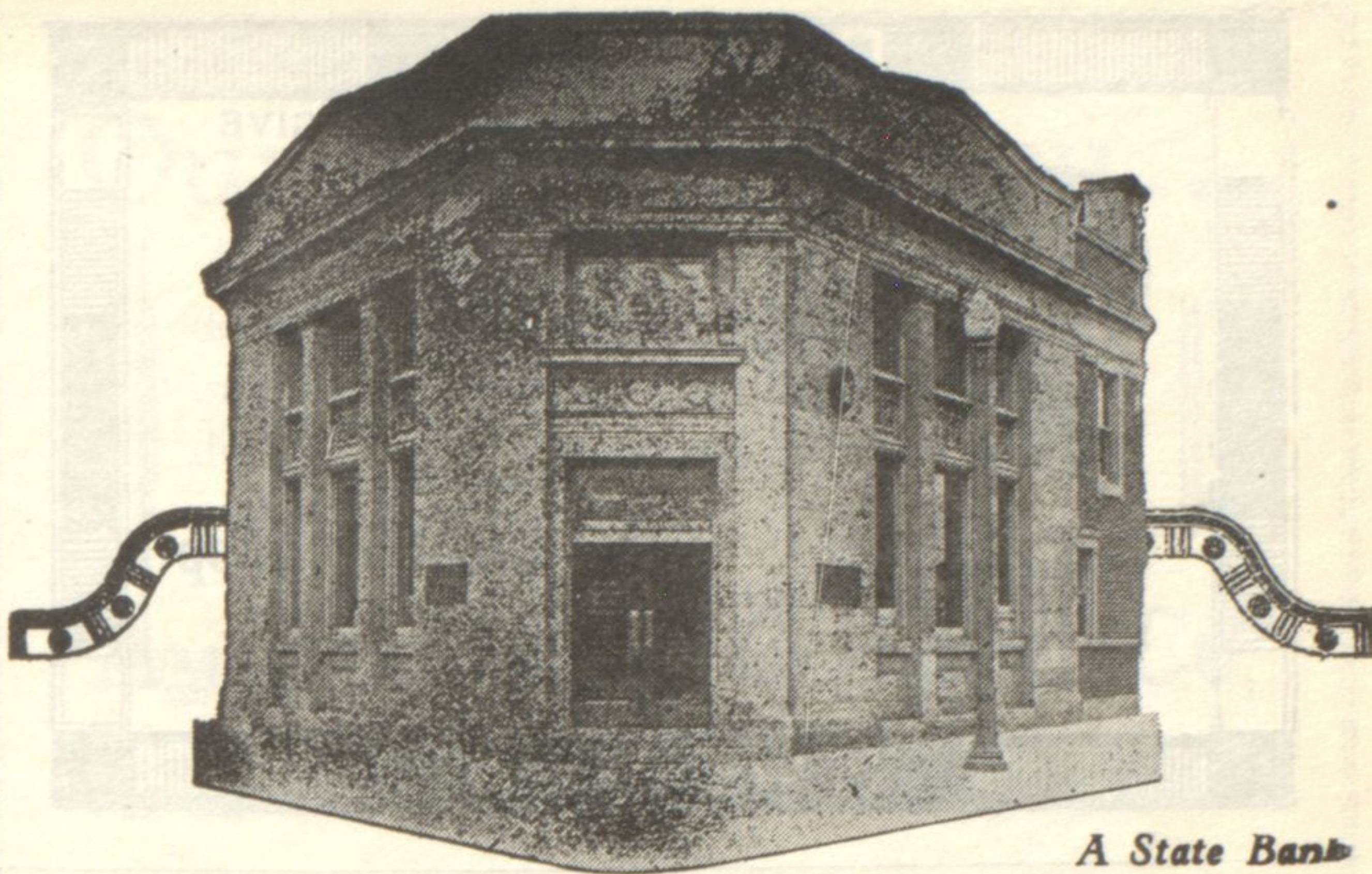
From Europe Mr. Schipa proceeded to Buenos Aires and from there to Chicago where he made his American debut, with Mme. Galli-Curci as premier lyric tenor of the Chicago Opera company. His outstanding achievements with the Civic Opera company have established him as one of the truly great personalities of the music world.

Unlike many successful opera stars, Mr. Schipa is a prime favorite in concert fields. He delights in this branch of his work. Schipa enthusiasts are legion throughout the country. He is entering upon his fifth season in the concert field.
