To Open Winnetka Home for Bridge Party October 18

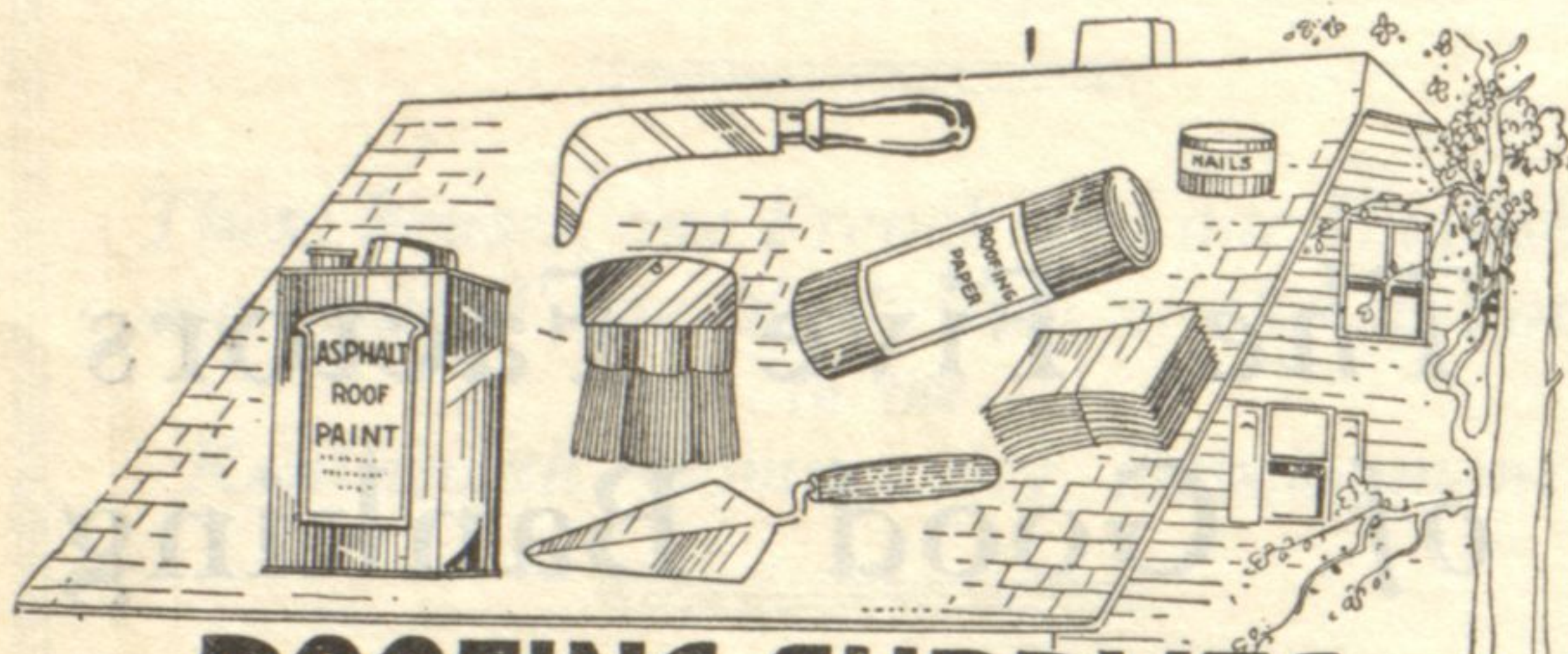

Officers for the Chicago and North shore chapter are: Mrs. E. J. Buffington of Evanston, president; Mrs. Dabney Maury, vice president;

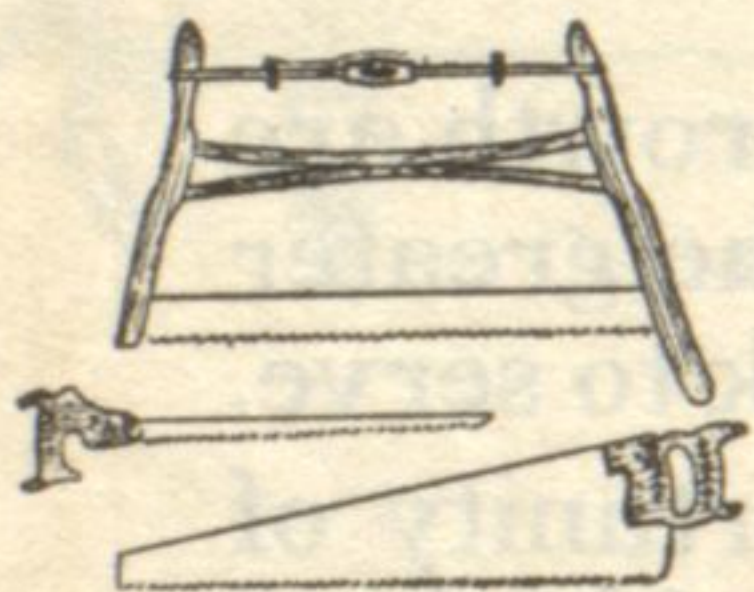

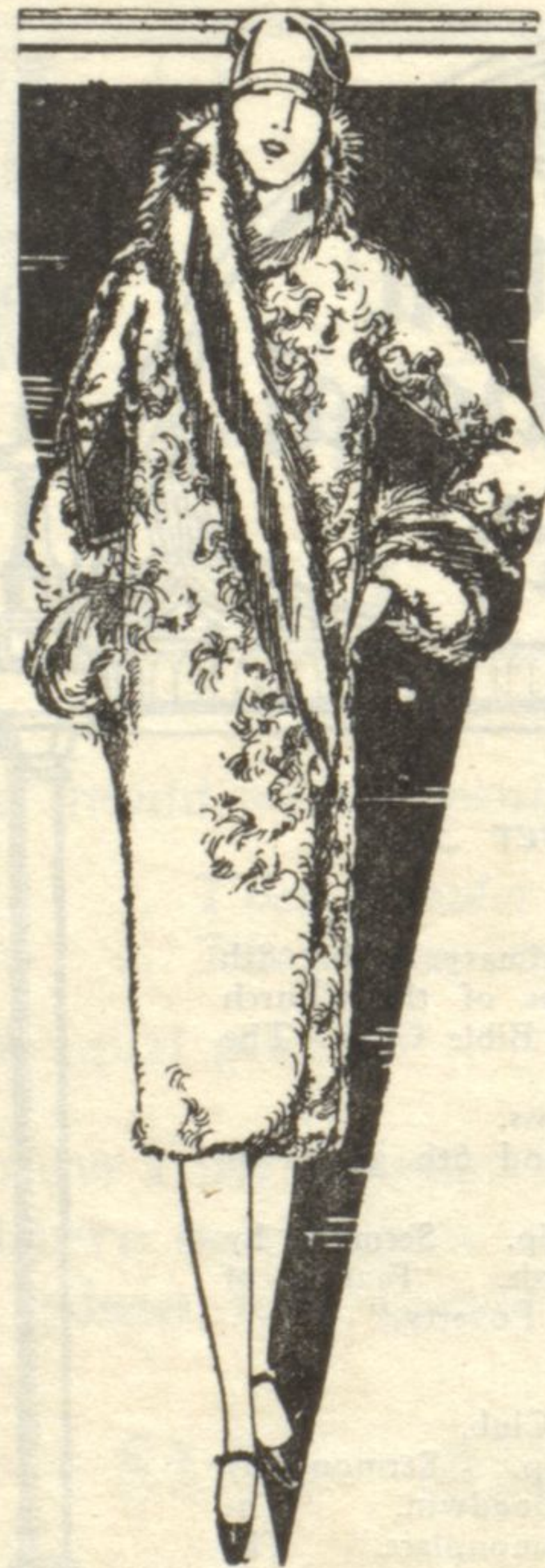
