VILLAGE THEATER

The odd bit of jewelery, once the property of the famous Corsican, was purchased together with other articles in a French museum for properties in the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer production. It is an exquisitely carved affair, and worth a small fortune outside its historic value.
