NORSHORE THEATRE

The photoplay version of "The Gay Deceiver," famous stage success which served as a vehicle for Leo Ditrichstein, is coming to the Norshore theatre Sunday, with Lew Cody in the title role that Ditrichstein played on the stage.

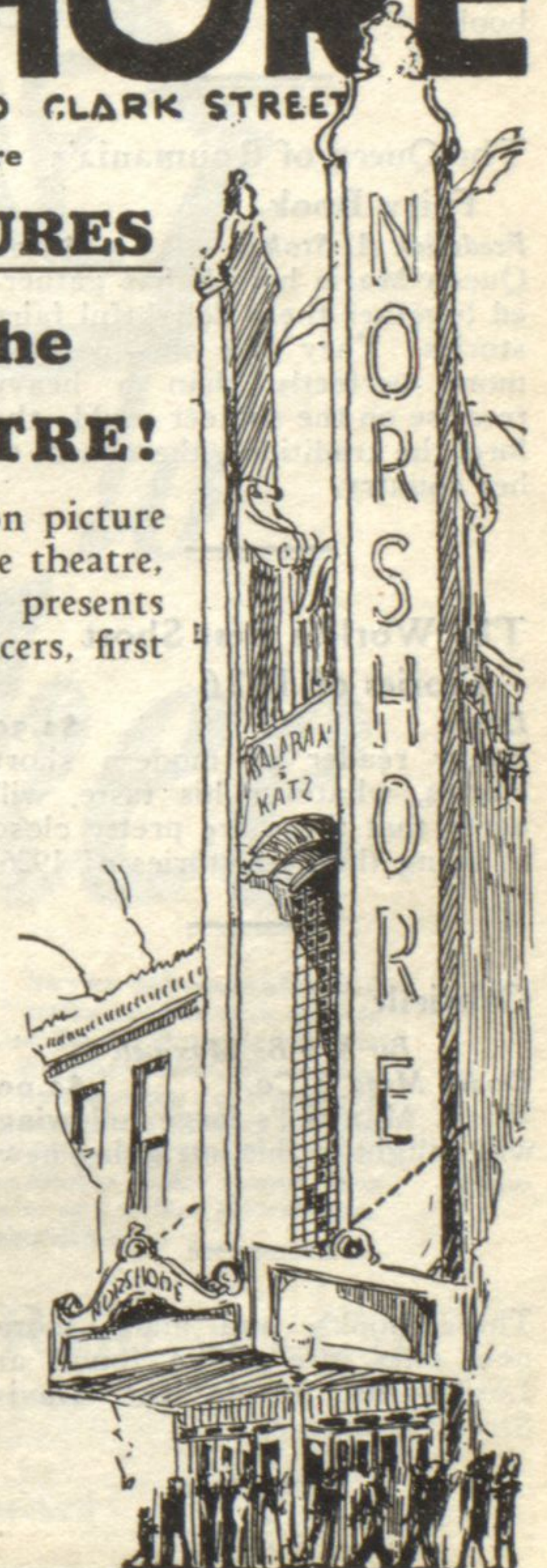
