George Lane, Lusitania Survivor, to Be Soloist

George Lane, popular as a basso here and abroad, and a veteran of the World war, has been engaged to sing at the Winnetka Congregational church, it was announced this week.

Lane was born in England, where he received his early training under Sir Charles Santley. He made his debut in America October 28, 1912, at Carnegie Hall, New York, as bass soloist with the famous Royal Gwent choir, and for two years following appeared in principal American cities with that organization.

Mr. Lane's experience in the war was declared to have been such that befall very few. When crossing the Atlantic on the ill-fated Lusitania for the purpose of enlisting in the British army, he was one of the few survivors of the two thousand passengers aboard the Lusitania when she was torpedoed off the Irish coast May 7, 1915.
