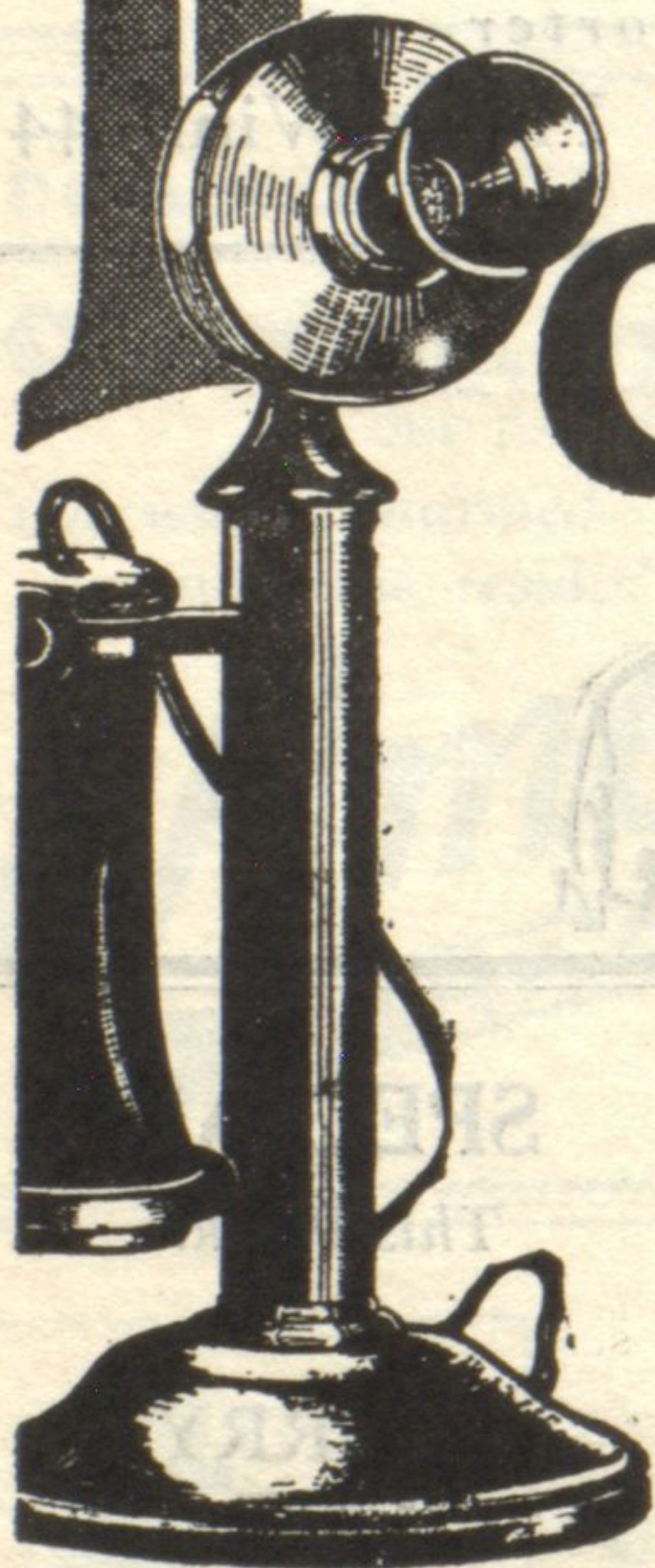
KENILWORTH SOCIETY
