Parker School
Principal Will
Address P. T. A.

Tuesday, October 26, at 3 o'clock, the Hubbard Woods Parent-Teacher association will hold its first afternoon meeting in the Assembly room of the school.

Miss Flora J. Cooke will talk on the social group project work of the Francis W. Parker school, of which she is principal. Miss Cooke has been active in education for years and has made a very definite contribution through her school.

Quoting from an article by Miss Cooke:

"For purposes of development children must be treated as individuals and not as a group, and that, in matters requiring formal drill, individual instruction and study are more effective and more economical than group instruction and drill."

Miss Cooke contends that "if the special function of a course in history is to teach children to live and cooperate successfully with their fellows, the school must be organized to establish in them those co-operative habits which produce people of social conscience and social power."

She will also outline in some detail her reasons for emphasizing the social group project.

Afternoon tea will be served, following the meeting. A one hundred percent attendance is expected.
