


ADOPT NEW PLAN FOR HANDLING OF FREIGHT

North Shore Line to Inaugurate Flatcar and Trailer Service That Is Unique

An innovation in the handling of less than carload lots of freight will feature this phase of service on the Chiprogram one of the cago, North Shore and Milwaukee railroad, the North Shore line, in the near future, when flatcar and trailer equipment specially designed for the "Road of Service" is placed in operation between Chicago and Milwaukee.

This is the first equipment of its kind ever to be placed in service on any railroad in the United States. It differs from equipment somewhat similar in nature in that the trailers are the Northwestern followers in singing mounted on the flatcars without the

Special runways are provided whereflatcar. Interlocking devices hold the trailers securely in place during tran-

The great savings in time and expense of handling shipments make this new equipment an outstanding contribution to the development of freight transportation. The trailers eliminate all extra handling of shipments, being loaded at the point of departure and unloaded at their destination.

The trailers will be hauled by motor truck to a central loading station, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick W. Gookin, where they will be mounted on flatcars.
