BAND FOR ROAD SAFETY

Evanston and Other Cook County Officials Form Metropolitan Body; See No help in Wholesale Arrests

Solution of the Cook county traffic problem progressed a step further this week with the formation of the Metropolitan Traffic Safety committee composed of Chicago, Evanston and Oak Park police officials and other organizations interested in the work. Chief Wiltberger represented Evanston at the meeting.

The committee which will function as a part of the Chicago Safety Council, met for the first time this week and laid plans for its future work.

At the first meeting this week a number of the members of the committee spoke on some of the problems of the traffic situation.

The consensus of the committeemen was that strict enforcement of all traffic laws would not lessen accidents. According to several speakers a campaign of wholesale arrests in several localities has failed to aid the situation.
