## Municipal News

The Village of Winnetka has adopted a modern machine bookkeeping system, for keeping customers' accounts and rendering monthly bills, in the interests of economy of operation and the convenience of consumers, and in accordance with the best practice of other public utilities. Instead of issuing separate bills for the various services rendered by the Village, one form of monthly bill will henceforth contain all charges to a customer for any or all of the following services—Electric Lights and Power, Garbage and Ash Collection and Sundry Village service.

Water will appear once every three months, on the same bill with the other named services.

Each bill will contain complete information as to meter readings, amount of consumption, gross charges, discount, and net amount of the total bill.

Heretofore all Village bills have been rendered on the first of each month. Because of the rapid growth of the Village, it has been necessary to divide it into three districts, with a different monthly billing date for each district, approximately as follows:

District No. and Boundaries: 1. South of center line of Willow Road; 2. Willow

Road to Pine Street; 3. North of center line of Pine Street. Monthly Billing Date: 25th, 30 and 5th. Last Discount: 10th, 15th and 20th.

Each bill will have stamped on it the "date" of the bill, and its "last discount date," giving in each case a full fifteen-day period in which to take advantage of the discount privilege, or five days longer than is usually allowed by Public Utilities.

Water service will be billed quarterly as in the past, but instead of all meters being read in December, March, June and September, the meters in District No. 1, south of Willow road only will be read in these months.

Water meters in District No. 2, between Willow and Pine will be read in January, April, July and October and water meters in District No. 3, north of Pine street, will be read in February, May, August and November.

Charges for water service will therefore appear on the same bill with other services, once every three months, as indicated above.

## Delegate to Congress in Tokio Guest of Atwoods

This congress, a gathering of the leading scientists of the day, is represented by only two dozen citizens of this country, and Mr. Atwood was appointed as one of the twenty-four delegates.

He will give several lectures, three public, and one before the congress, at which he will talk on "Travel and Exploration in Alaska."
