## KIDS VIEW "ARCTIC"

Paul Warren Shows Movies of Field Expedition to Arctic Waters to North Shore Country Day School

Moving pictures and a story of the five thousand mile trip into Arctic waters of the Rawson sub-Arctic expedition of the Field Museum, were given to the children of the North Shore Country Day school at a morning exercise, Monday, by Paul C. Warren, a parent of the school, who was a member of that expedition last summer.

The expedition had been made possible by the generosity of Fred Rawson, of Chicago, and was under the direct command of Commander Donald B. MacMillan.

The purpose of the trip was to collect specimens of birds, flowers and fish, and to attempt to definitely prove that the old Norsemen came down the Labrador coast to America eight hundred to one thousand years ago. The expedition journeyed to certain islands off the coast of Labrador and found remains thereon which show that the Norsemen had reached out from Iceland across to Labrador.

This MacMillan expedition sailed from Maine last June, along the coast of Nova Scotia, Labrador and Newfoundland, where they were held back by heavy ice banks, thence across to Greenland for three weeks, then back to Baffin land and down the coast and home. The two boats were eighty-eight foot sailing vessels.

Mr. Warren showed some splendid motion pictures, among them being scenes of Dr. Grenfell's Labrador colonies; the Newfoundland fishing fleet and hundreds of magnificent icebergs. He will bring the second part of the film to the school, Monday, November 1.
