approval of the design, and reiterated the legion's insistence that the memorial should not include reference to legion members, but only to the gold star men. Rev. Dr. J. W. F. Davies said he had opposed the design when it was first brought forward, but was now squarely in support of it and anxious to see it executed. He saw in the monument possibilities for impressing the meaning of citizenship and patriotism upon our foreign-born residents and upon our own children.

"Symbol of Idealism"

Rev. E. Ashley Gerhard saw the memorial as an expression and a symbol of the high idealism which pervaded both soldiers and civilians during the war. He believed it would help to foster a spirit of service and devotion to the public welfare in time to come.

H. A. deWindt announced that a letter soliciting subscriptions would be sent to each family in the village at once. The object of the canvass is to secure contributions from as many people as possible, emphasizing the fact that this is a memorial of and for all the residents of Winnetka.

The model of the monument will be displayed in the schools and also in Community House. On motion of Mr. Davies, the following resolution was unanimously adopted.

"Resolved: That this public meeting, called in the Village of Winnetka, in the interest of a memorial, heartily commends and approves the plans and model on the Winnetka memorial, as presented."
