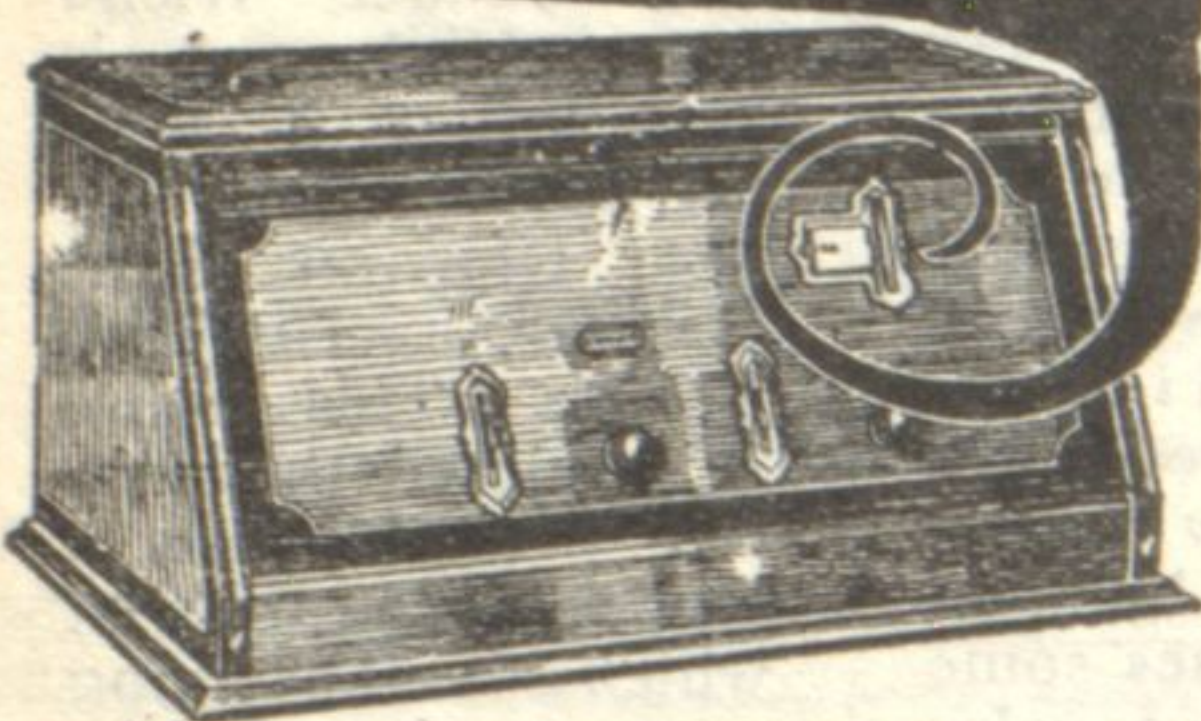

Advance Dr. A. H. Curtis to Head of Department

Dr. Arthur H. Curtis, 2706 Lincoln street, has been made professor of gynecology and chairman of that department in the medical school of Northwestern university, succeeding the late Dr. Thomas Watkins.

Dr. Curtis, one of the younger medical men on the staff, previous to achieving his degrees in medicine, was a former coach and stellar baseball and football player at the University of Kansas and the University of Wisconsin. He took his training at Rush Medical school and Cook County hospital and did two years' graduate work in Berlin and Vienna. He has published a number of important scientific papers, and is president of the American Gynecological society for the year 1927.

Truth Finds Supreme Expression in Christ, Morning Class Told

At this week's Tuesday morning class on November 2, which meets in the Neighborhood room of Community House at 10 and to which the public is invited, there were presented the seventh, eighth, and ninth chapters of the Gospel of John—that John, who was probably not one of the apostles nor a second century theologian but quite likely a young Greek, living in Jerusalem and an intimate friend of Jesus who later moved to Ephesus and preached there the contents of this book. As the Rev. James A. Richards interpreted these chapters they spoke most eloquently of some great truths. He commented as follows:

"The criticisms and questions about the humble origin of Jesus, and his lack of a formal education, emphasized the thought that humility of origin is no argument and no limitation; that what matters is what you can do, not where you came from. Healing a man on the Sabbath exhibits Jesus, as always, putting the right heart and kindly serviceable deed above ritualistic symbols and worship. In what was an interpolation by another author but the most moving, tender story in all the Gospels, that of the woman taken in sin, we see Jesus' attitude toward the wandering and mistaken souls of earth, and we note the forgiveness of God contrasted with the hardness we exhibit toward each other's short-comings.

"Because of the intimacy of Jesus with God and because he was the best interpretation of God, we speak of the divinity of Jesus. His declaration, 'Before Abraham was, I am,' indicated the timelessness of Jesus and that the Truth, always struggling for utterance through prophets and teachers, found its supreme expression in Him.

"In curing the man born blind, Christ emphatically denied that all physical suffering is caused by moral or spiritual short-coming. We can't expect to solve the problem of evil in the world; we can't explain the purpose of illness and trouble. We only know these things can be met so they become glorified and one's greatest opportunity for development."
