

Use Powerful Magnet to Remove Splinter from Eye

Carl Braun, of 931 Oak street, Winnetka, a member of the firm of Braun Brothers, 723 Oak street, is in the Evanston hospital where he was taken Monday, following an injury to an eye.

While driving a nail, a large piece of the head chipped off and became deeply imbedded in Mr. Braun's right

eye. The magnet, at the Evanston hospital, was not strong enough to remove it but the more powerful instrument at the Chicago Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat hospital drew it out.

Dr. Dodd, who performed the operation, says there is a bare possibility that the eye may be saved, but declared the injury may impair the vision, if not totally destroy it. Several days will be necessary to determine the final outcome.
