The death of Howard McAllaster, son of Mrs. H. McAllaster of 547 Sheridan road, occurred Wednesday, November 3, following an illness of two months.

Mr. McAllaster was born in Winnetka, and has lived here during his lifetime, with the exception of the years he spent away at college. He was very active in scholastic and extra-curricular activities while in school, having graduated from Wiliston Seminary in East Hampton, Mass., and from Dartmouth college in the class of 1908.

While in Dartmouth he was interested in journalism and editing, and was editor-in-chief of the "Aegis," the Dartmouth annual, and was editor-in-chief of "The Dartmouth," the school paper. Mr. McAllaster also excelled scholastically and belonged to the Casquet and Gauntlett, senior honor society.

After graduation, he returned to Winnetka and associated himself with his brothers in their printing establishment in Chicago. He was a member of the Glencoe Masonic lodge.

Funeral services were held in the Memorial park chapel, Friday, November 5, with the Rev. James Austin Richards officiating. Burial was in Memorial park.

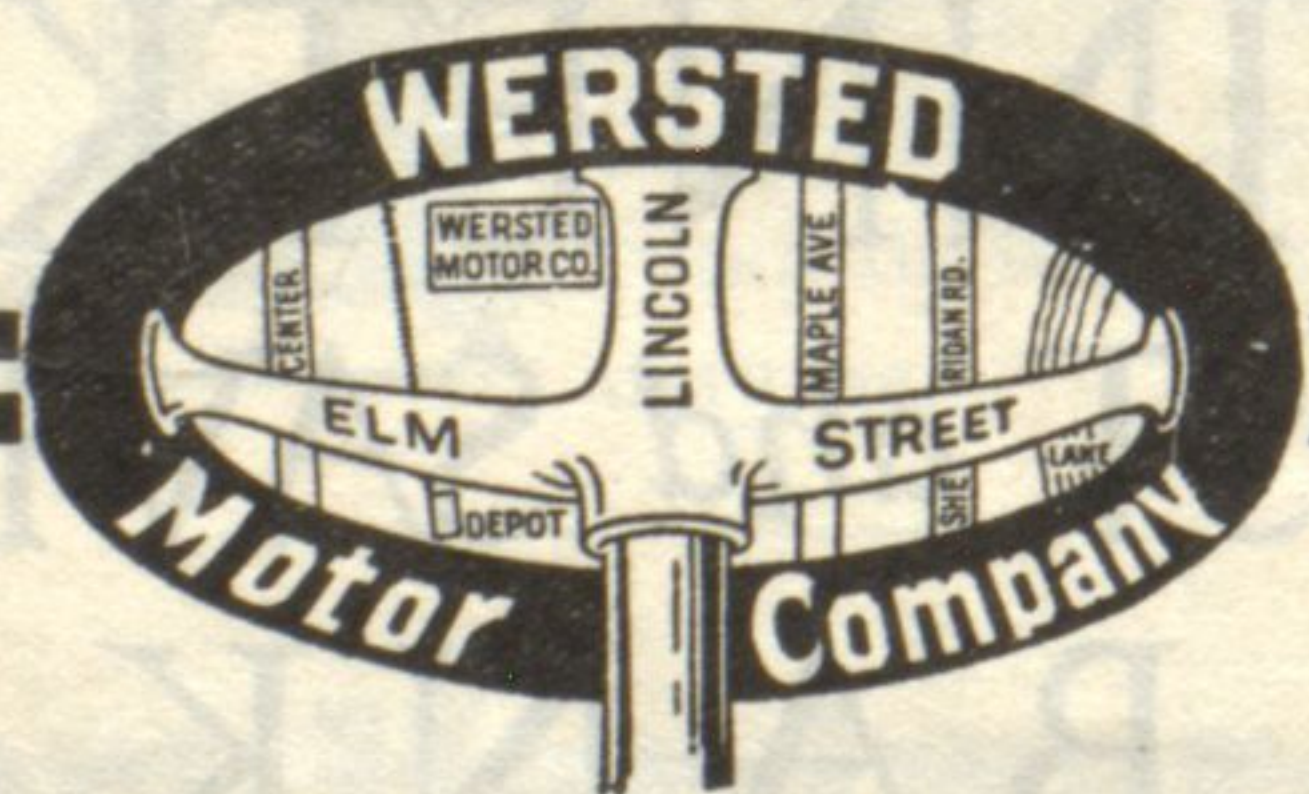
He is survived by his mother, two brothers, Alfred, Bennett, and three sisters, May, Ethel and Fannie.
