WHAT IS CHURCH FOR? DR. PATTON INQUIRES

need to be encouraged, and stabilized. The Church should be a motive power to them when they are becalmed, and an anchor to them when they are drifting.

"And the Church exists primarily, for the public worship of God. Among all the institutions of society it is the only one that accomplishes this purpose. 'I find,' said Oliver Wendell Holmes, writing to Phillips Brooks after attending one of his services, 'I find that there is a little plant of reverence in a corner of my heart, and it needs to be watered at least once a week.' There is a little plant of reverence in everybody's heart; and if it dies out, if a man comes to where nothing is sacred to him and there is nothing in the universe which he can or does worship, the finest thing in him has died. The Church is here to see that it doesn't die."

Urges Church Unity

As incidental to the answering of his main question "What's a Church For?" Dr. Patton spoke of Church Unity, saying that the best kind of unity is illustrated by the common purpose and generous co-operation of the churches in Winnetka. Such unity among churches as we can reasonably look for will come not as a result of big conventions and elaborate plans drawn up by those in authority and handed down to the rest of us, but from pastors and people on their actual fields of labor, trying out such common efforts for the community as promise reasonable success in the common cause. Denominations are not a curse, but sectarianism is.

The last of Dr. Patton's talks will be given next Wednesday evening on the subject, "Christianity and the Nations," at Christ Church Parish House.
