CHAUTAUQUA HEAD WILL ADDRESS SUNDAY CLUB

Sunday Evening Club to Observe Armistice Sunday With Dr. Arthur Bestor as Speaker

Dr. Arthur E. Bestor, president of Chatauqua institution, Chatauqua, N. Y., will speak before the Wilmette Sunday Evening club when it observes Armistice Sunday, November 14. Wilbur D. Nesbit, author of "Your Flag and My Flag," will be present and recite that well known poem. The Imperial quartet of Chicago will sing for the first time before the club. Its program will include one of Mr. Nesbits' songs, "Land of Mine." The Wilmette American Legion post will attend in a body, and the girl scouts will usher.

Dr. Bestor will speak on "International Question." Modern Europe and the Near East have been the special fields of Dr. Bestor's study for two decades. He has traveled widely and studied conditions at first hand. In 1922 he spent five months in Europe and the Eastern Mediterranean, Palestine, Egypt, Syria, and the coast towns of Asia Minor, Constantinople,

and then returned through the Balkans to Italy.

Studies Labor Conditions

A study of the Labor government in action was the object of Dr. Bestor's trip to London for the spring of 1924. The interest of the Labor leaders in the subject of adult education brought exceptional opportunities to continue his study of British conditions.

As president of Chautauqua institution, Dr. Bestor is constantly in touch with social and political movements and with the men and women who, at home and abroad, are shaping the thought and activity of our times. He has spoken before the leading clubs, colleges, forums, and associations of all kinds throughout the United States.

Master of Subjects

Dr. Bestor is known as a master of the subjects he discusses, presenting his material in an interesting manner and having an admirable delivery. In this country Chautauqua for over fifty years has been the leading institution in this field. Its own home reading work resulted in the organization of the British Home Reading union, out of which developed the close relationship between the Labor movement and the English universities.
