

First Big Ten Title in Reach as Purple Wildcats Play Hawks

Prospects of bringing to Northwestern the first conference football championship in history stirred the Purple clad warriors to added endeavor this week as they prepared for the last game of the season with Iowa at Iowa City Saturday.

The decisive licking which Coach Glenn Thistlethwaite's boys handed the Chicago Maroons last week stamped the Wildcats as one of the strongest elevens in the country, and they will be out Saturday to put the finishing touches on the most successful season which a Northwestern grid team has ever enjoyed.

Football was the chief topic of conversation on Northwestern campus this week as the students made ready to journey in a special train to Iowa City to root for the team in a game which if won will give the Purple the championship or at least a tie for first honors. At the present time Northwestern and Michigan are tied for first place.

Pile Up 168 Points

Coach Thistlethwaite has brought his Purple clad warriors through the present season in fine style. With the exception of the Notre Dame game the Wildcats won all their games with top heavy scores. The Purple piled up 168 points to their opponents' 16 points in all the games played this season.

Every bit of strength which North-

western can muster will be hurled against the Hawkeyes Saturday in order to assure a Purple victory. The last time Northwestern journeyed to Iowa the Hawks gave them a 35 to 3 licking and it is to avenge that defeat that Coach Thistlethwaite will send his powerful eleven into the forthcoming engagement.

Nine Northwestern players will compete in their last football game for the Purple Saturday. Heading the list of seniors is Capt. Ralph "Moon" Baker who has galloped so gallantly for the Purple in three years of conference football. Other backfield men who will pass out of the collegiate picture are Ade Schumacher, halfback, and Ziggy Solheim, quarterback, two Evanston boys.

Bob Johnson, sensational tackler, and Otto Siebenmann, hefty guard, are the two leading linemen, who will plug the line for the last time Saturday. Other linemen who graduate next

spring are Ellis Bovik, end; Gordon Rahr and Stev Fox, guards, and Art Kuiper, tackle.

The defeat of Chicago last Saturday while generally expected was not doped to be such a run away for the Purple. From the opening kick off which Vic Gustafson ran back for a touchdown to the final gun the superiority of the Purple was never in question. After the Wildcats had piled up 31 points, the Maroons staged a belated rally and pushed over a touchdown but later the Wildcats came back and got another.

As usual the Purple line was impregnable and it was only by the forward passing route that Stagg's boys could do a thing. However, in this style of play the Wildcats showed their superiority. They passed all over the field, one of Baker's passes to Fisher being hurled a distance of 50 yards.

Capt. Baker played one of the greatest games of his career. He passed, kicked and ran with the ball with all of his usual effectiveness. The dominating feature of his work, however, was his passing. He tossed the ball 11 times and six of the passes were successful. Once he chose to receive one from Gustafson and ran that one over for a touchdown.

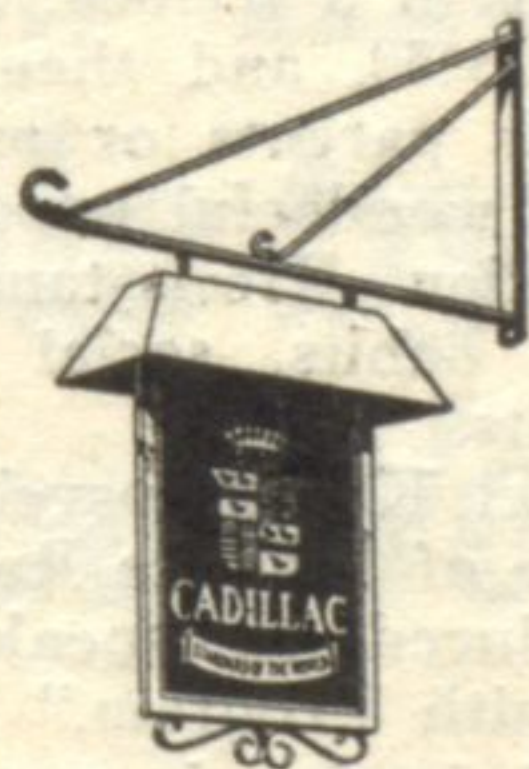
