There are six girls who received an average of four, five seniors and a freshman, while there are only two boys, both seniors.

Here's something else. In spite of the fact that there are fewer senior girls than any other group in school, they have an overwhelmingly large number on the honor roll, twenty-eight, against the junior girls' sixteen and the senior boys' ten. Besides that they have sixteen with honorable mention and only two on the delinquent list.

Teamster Adopts Stray Canine That Turns "Protector"


