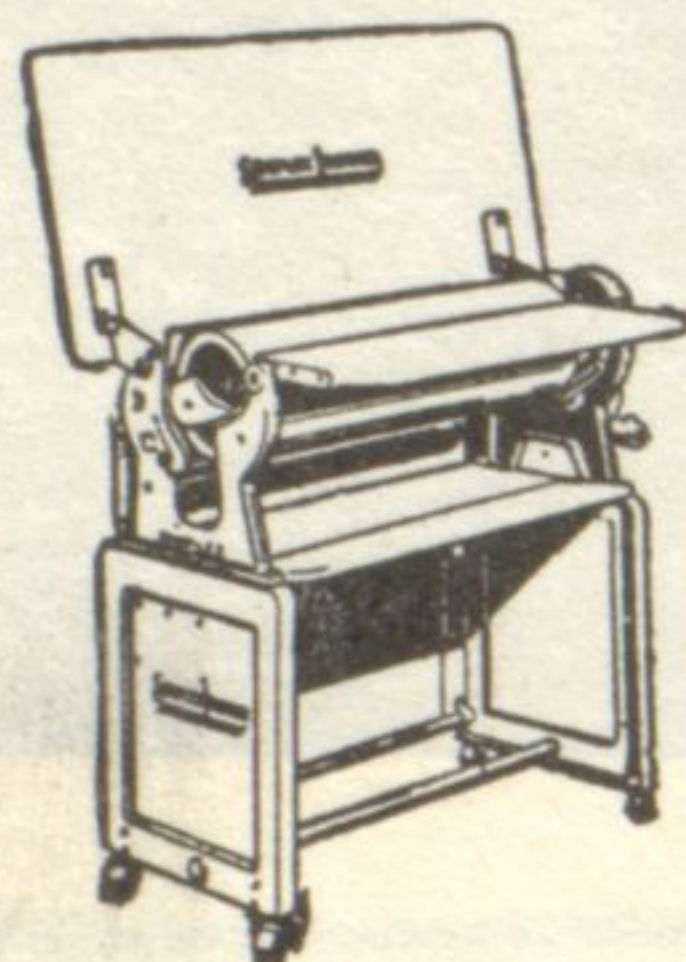

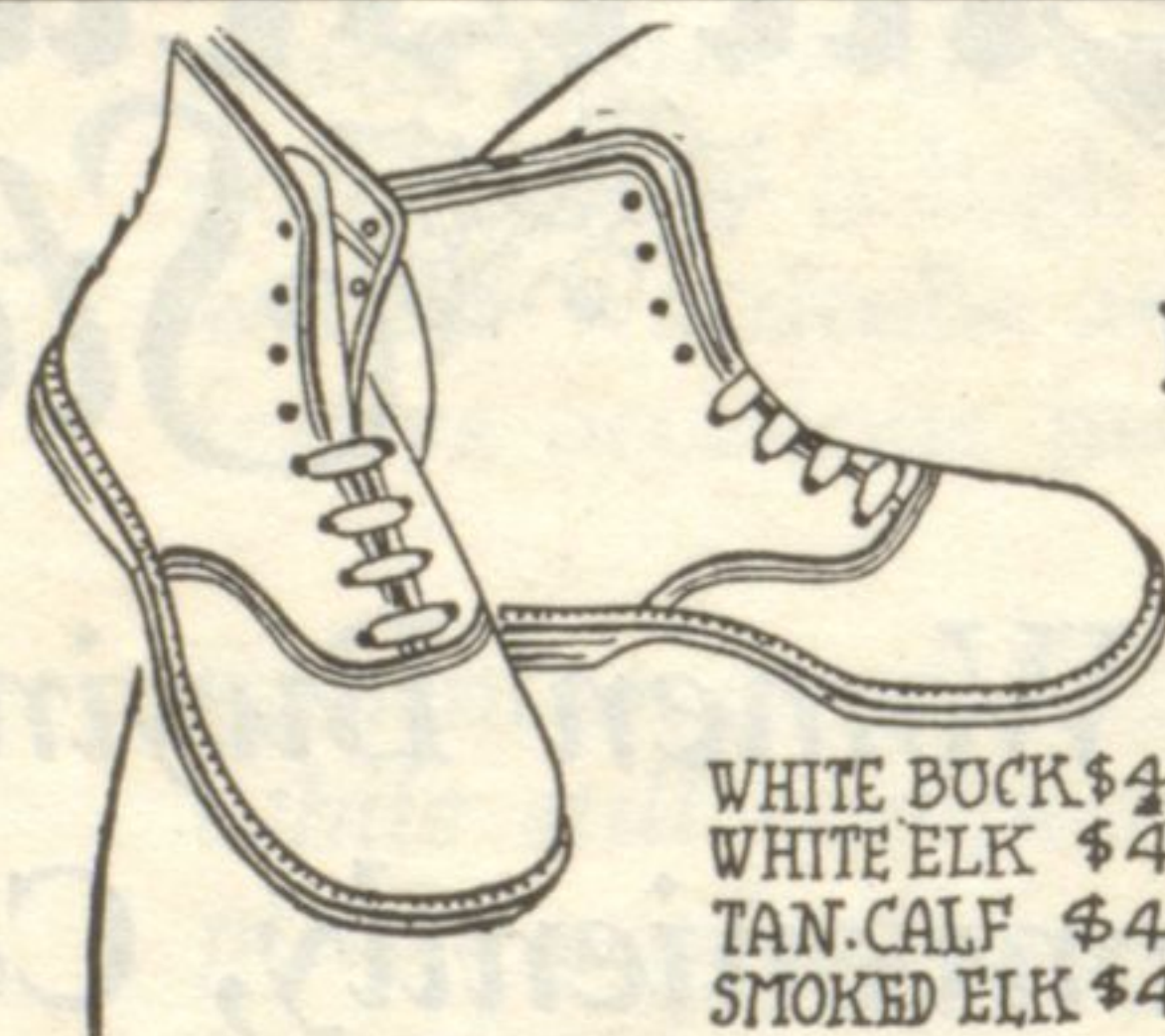
Horace Bridges to Give Lectures at Orrington Hotel

Horace J. Bridges, leader of The Chicago Ethical society, is giving a series of lectures at the Orrington hotel, Evanston, Sunday afternoons at 5:15 p. m.
