**Announce Golden Rule Day
to Aid Near East Country**

Every county in the state of Illinois will join this year in the observance of Golden Rule Sunday, December 5, that date being set apart for consideration of the plight of 35,000 orphaned children in the Bible lands and other parts of the Near East.

Following the approval of President Coolidge, every state is represented by a committee at present busy with plans for the proper observance of that date and former Governor Frank O. Lowden again heads the committee in Illinois. This is the third annual Golden Rule day, the first being celebrated at Geneva, Switzerland, when representatives of thirty-one nations gathered and formulated plans for the relief of the stricken children left homeless by massacre, war, deportation and pestilence.

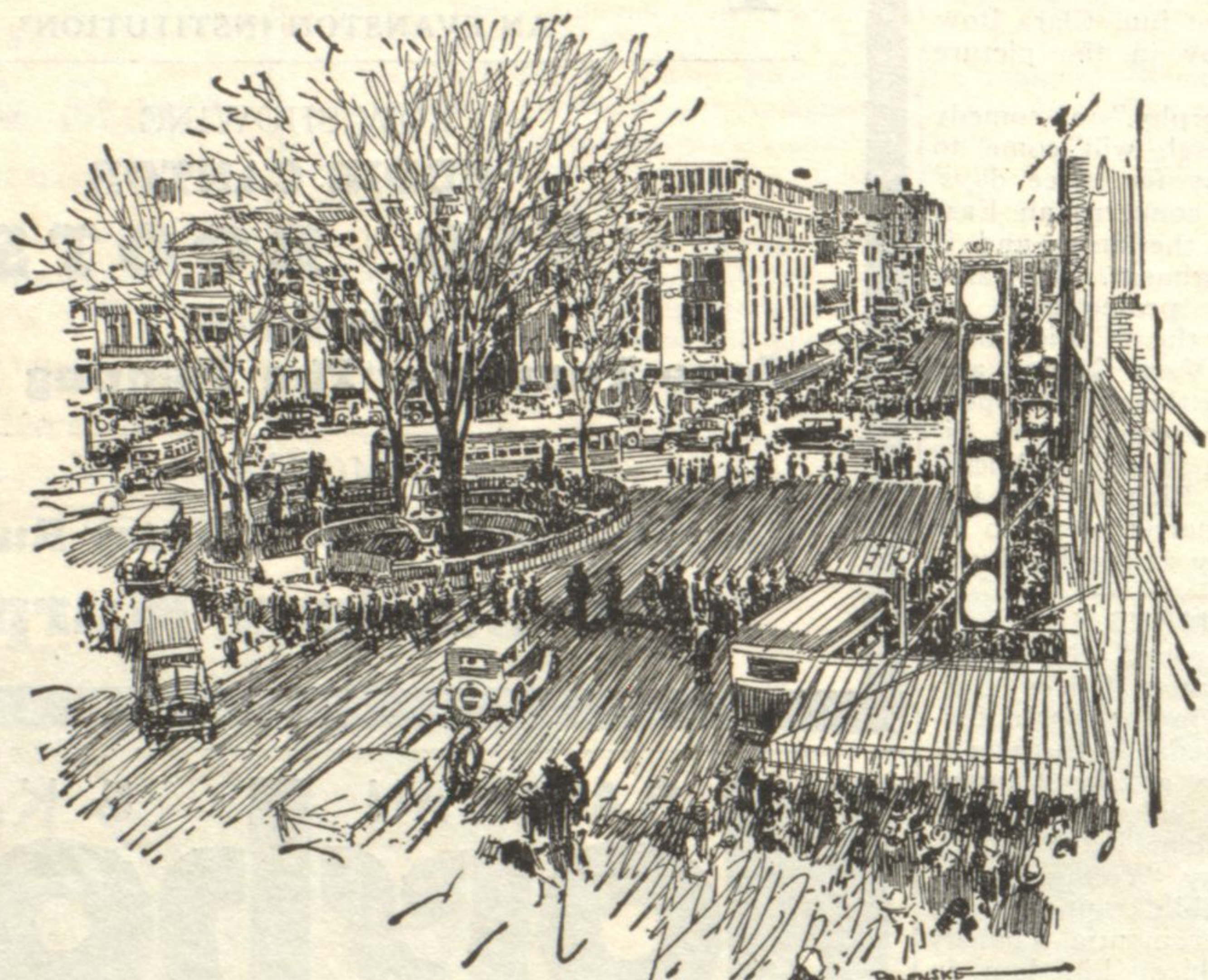
**Winnetka Girl Gets Place
