Complete Building of Church Parish House

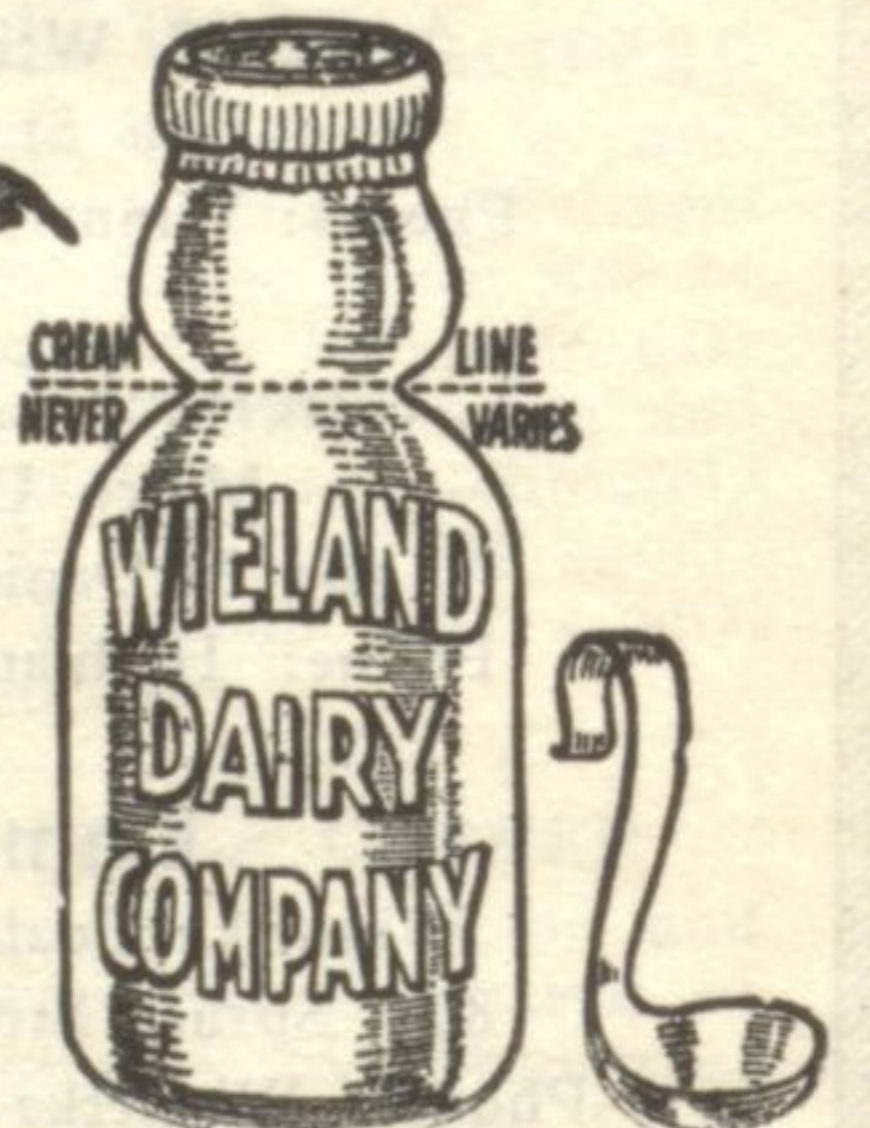
