"Please give me a low number for my car-anything in two-figures or three figures, but if you can't give me attractively packed in decorated metal that, at least a four-figure number."

That, in substance, is the plea in hundreds of letters piled up on the desk of Secretary of State Louis L. Emmerson. There are more application for low numbers this year than ever before and their are fewer avail-

Under the law the holder of a low number may have it re-assigned to him provided he makes application at least 30 days prior to January 1.
