**VILLAGE THEATRE**

"The Quarterback" will be shown at the Village theatre Monday and Tuesday, December 27 and 28. It is a comedy-romance that is truly original and spontaneous and has been heralded far and wide by all who have seen it as one of the season's film high-lights. The football game featured was directed and organized by "Hurry Up" Yost, Michigan's far famed coach, and Richard Dix, one of filmdom's best known stars, plays the lead.

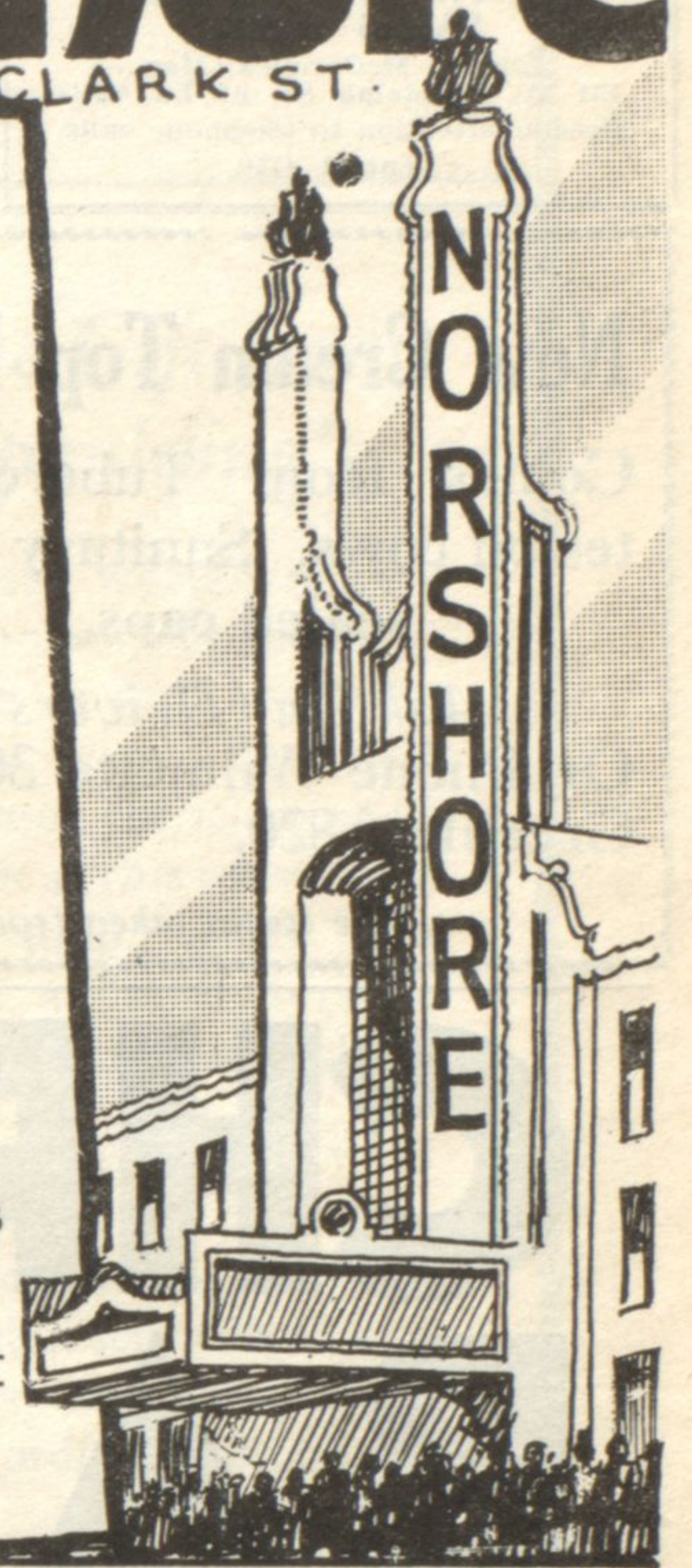
