

MAIL 40 MATTRESSES

Dr. Barlow-Brown's Appeal for Beds for Chinese Girls Finds Immediate Response in Village

As a result of efforts made by Winnetka friends, as well as through a letter and article published in the WINNETKA TALK several weeks ago, the request made by Dr. Alice Barlow Brown, formerly of Winnetka, now associated with Yenching college in Peking, China, has been fulfilled to the extent of \$200.

Dr. Brown, well-known to former Winnetka school children, where she carried on her work as school physician, as well as her private practice, is stationed in Yenching college. She wrote asking whether anyone would be interested in contributing toward a fund for mattresses for the girls' beds, at \$5 a mattress. Checks came in to Mrs. W. H. King of 672 Maple avenue, and the fund began to increase. Following the publication of a portion of a letter from Dr. Brown, one resident of the village enclosed a generous check with the following letter: "It gives me a considerable amount of pleasure to send this contribution to Dr. Brown, as I feel it is a very small return, indeed, to make for kindnesses rendered me when she was practicing in Winnetka. These services were so freely given and they came so directly from the heart, that she endeared herself to me, just as she has to many others with whom she has come in contact. 'I am sure there is a great reward awaiting Dr. Brown to repay her for the great life of service she has lived and is living.'"

Having raised altogether \$200, those in charge of the fund felt it would be gratifying to Dr. Brown to know of the success of the fund at Christmas time. A cablegram was sent which read, "Mailing forty mattresses. Greetings." The draft for the money is to be sent immediately.
