teur athletics, wholesome social activities and aid for those who are in need. The club membership now consists of fifteen honorary members, and twenty active members.

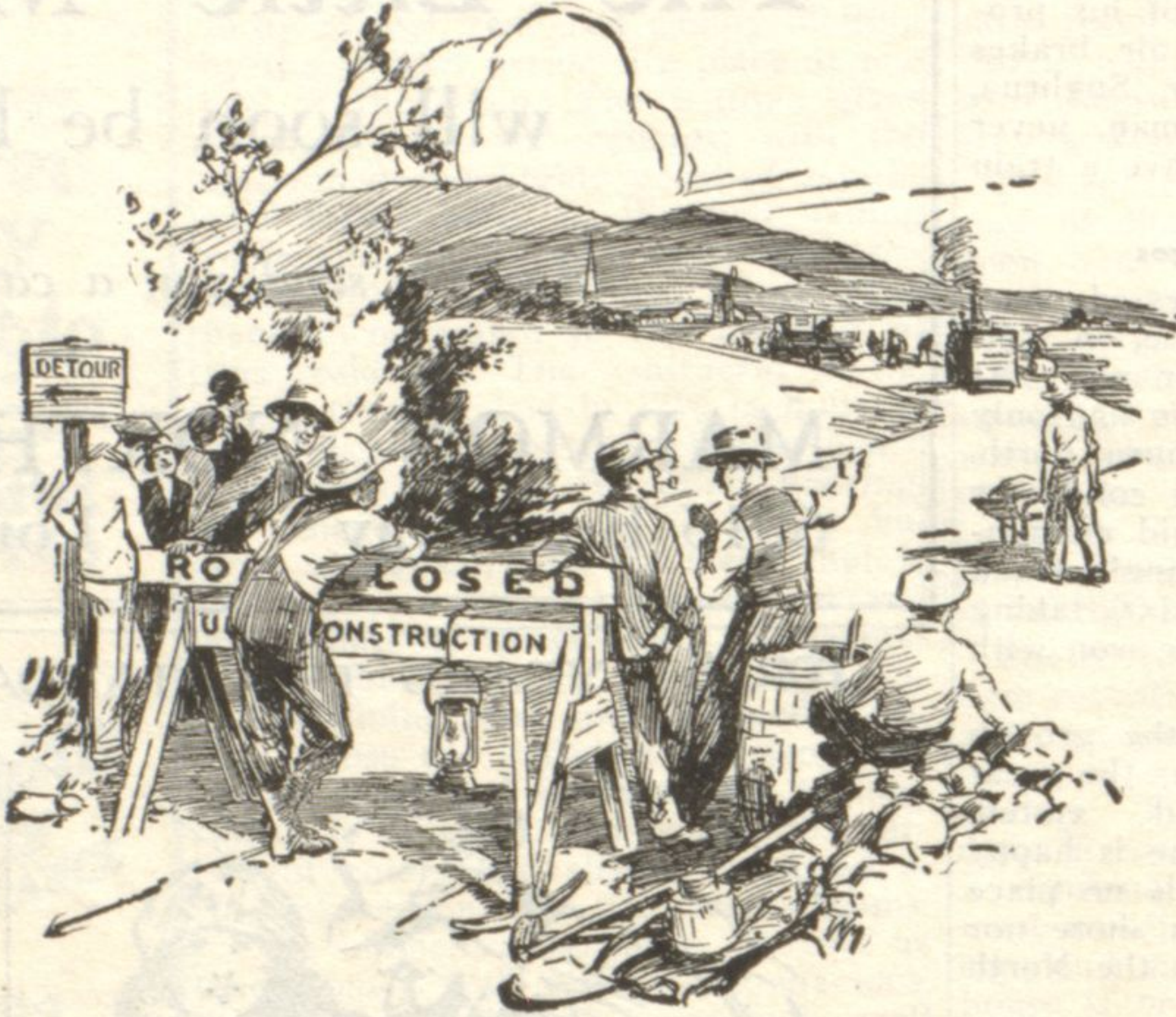
