

**Need Shown for Larger Boiler at Light Plant**

Tuesday evening at the meeting of the Winnetka village council, Village Manager, H. L. Woolhiser made a report to that body on plans for increasing the boiler capacity at the water and light plant.

Owing to the increase in the demand for electric energy, the village manager announced that it will be necessary to replace an old 300 horse power boiler with a new 500 unit. It is expected that bids for the boiler and a forced draft stoker will be taken by the council at its meeting Tuesday evening, January 18.

John R. Moore, of South Chicago, is consulting engineer on the project.

**Chicago Editor Purchases Home Site in Kenilworth**

The Wilmette office of McGuire and Orr reports the sale of vacant lots located on the northwest corner of the intersection of Sunset road and Woodland street, Winnetka, to Arthur Luke, builder and contractor. Mr. Luke, it is reported, will immediately start building operations on two houses; one a Colonial and the other an English house; both to be ready for May 1 possession. The lots were purchased from Frank Mueller, and R. R. Jenness of McGuire and Orr represented both parties.

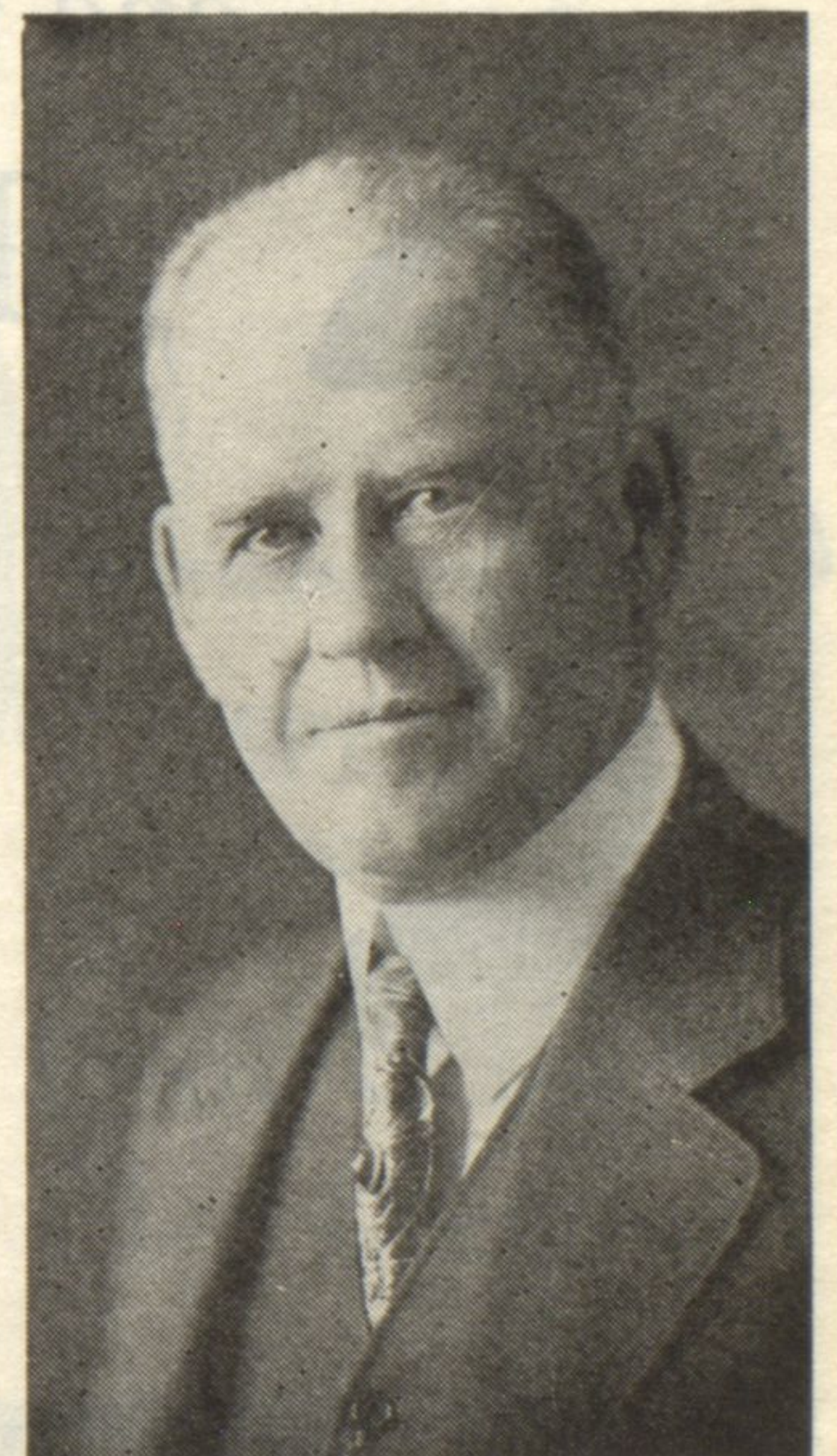
