

The young Saxon composer, Julius Reubke, died in his early twenties; he lived only long enough to produce this one monumental organ composition and a little piano music. His name is scarcely noted in music annals, yet he wrote himself into the records of genius with a single glorious effort.

The German school composition with its austere polyphony is further represented on the program with the Wolstenholme "Sonata in the Style of Handel," two Wagner transcriptions, and the Max Reger "Benedictus." For contrast, a group of three compositions of the Frenchman, Joseph Bonnett, conclude the program.

These concerts are free and the public is cordially invited.
