

Noted Psychiatrist Speaks to Parents on Child's Conduct

Dr. John Favill, noted psychiatrist and neurologist of Chicago, gave a lecture on the "Problems of Adolescence," at a meeting of the parents and teachers of the seventh and eighth grades of the North Shore Country Day school, last Tuesday.

As premises of his talk, Dr. Favill made three points about the general rearing of the child in the home. First, that the child has to be convinced that life is a matter of choices, that "you cannot have your cake and eat it too." Next, that the parent should convince the child that the parent's experience is worth something and is to be followed, and, lastly, that home discipline should result from persuasion and not from force.

"The actual problems of adolescence," Dr. Favill said, "depend upon heredity and environment. Heredity cannot be altered but environment can, and the special problems of adolescence are not so much inherent in its age as in those of the decade before, from the ages of 2 to 12. The child has to have someone in whom to confide and very often this comes to be someone outside the home, because at some time the parents have failed to give the child full confidence.

"Indications of trouble are too great secretiveness on the part of the child, depression and sullenness. When these become exaggerated, it is wise to seek the advice of a physician."
