Boys' Lumberjacks \$5.50 to \$6.50

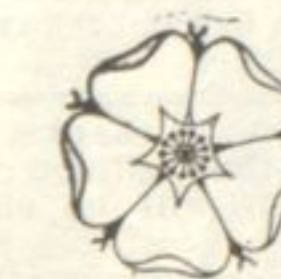
Firm quality all-wool light and dark plaids—sizes 6 to 16. Nicely tailored, and cut full enough so they'll wear well.
