

Northbrook Pushes Improvements in Newer Districts

Sidewalk and storm sewer on Waukegan road from Shermer avenue to the north limits of Northbrook, are among the many extensive improvements which are underway in that thriving village at the western threshold of Glencoe and which is doing its share towards ultimately building up the intervening vacant lands.

At the next meeting of the Northbrook village board, February 15, bids will be opened for building this sidewalk and sewer. The sidewalk will be on the west side of the street, passing in front of the school house property.

On the same evening, the Village board will hold a public hearing on the matter of installing water mains and building sidewalks in Northbrook Heights, a large subdivision in the west part of the village.

The board, at its meeting Tuesday evening of this week, approved the plat of Hambly & company's subdivision, a tract of thirty-three acres at the southwest corner of Waukegan and Dundee roads, on which the sale of lots is now going forward and which it is said is to be completely developed as rapidly as possible.

President Lauer of the Northbrook Village board asserts that upwards of 900 acres have been annexed to the village within a comparatively short time, 800 acres of which has been taken in within the past year.

Within one small area of the village, comprising something like three blocks, twelve fine new homes have been erected during the past year and President Lauer says the building boom is scattered throughout the village. He says he anticipates the biggest building period the present year that the village has ever witnessed.
