HEAR HARVARD COACH

Arnold Horween Tells Pupils at Country Day School How Modern Football Is Played

Arnold Horween, football coach at Harvard university, visited the North Shore Country Day school at Winnetka February 3, when he talked to the school assembly on how football is being conducted at Harvard.

He said that during the season about 145 men go out for the sport and they are divided into two major squads, of 35 each, the balance being sent to play on class teams.

There is an inter-class series of games, he explained, the winner of which plays the inter-class champions at Yale. Freshman football is a separate organization, he said, a series being played between the dormitory teams and also with the Yale Freshmen. The whole system is a unit with flexible interchange and advancement of players.

"Times have changed since the old days," said Coach Horween, emphasizing the fact that it is how you play the game, and not the winning that counts now. The biggest factor in getting a good team, is self-discipline on the part of the individual players, he declared.

Mr. Horween is a north shore man, a graduate of the Francis Parker High school, Chicago. He played on the Harvard football team, in the class of 1920 and was appointed to the position of coach, at Harvard, last spring.
