

**Lewis Proves Star
on Track as Well
as on Gridiron**

Leland "Tiny" Lewis, Northwestern university football and track star, is developing into one of the most versatile college athletes in the country. Always outstanding in his gridiron performances, he is turning in some enviable work on the track this season which marks him as a capable all-around athlete.

Successful in his football career, "Tiny" turned to track following the fall grid campaign and in his first big meet picked up two firsts and a tie for second. It was due largely to his performances that the Purple was able to defeat Notre Dame. His victories in the shot put and hurdles and his tie for second in the high jump gave Northwestern the winning points.

"Tiny" specializes in the shot put, an event in which he ranks among the best in the conference. He tosses the 16-pound iron ball around 45 feet and hopes to add to that distance by the time of the indoor conference at Evanston, March 11-12.

His ability in the hurdles is rather unusual for a man of his size. He weighs 200 pounds and is six feet one inch tall. Despite his bulk it is well distributed and enables him to get away to a fast start. While not a star in the high jump he is able to pick up points in dual meets and will probably develop into a dangerous competitor in this event.

Opening of the out-door season will find the versatility of this husky youth even more pronounced. He will then take up the discus and javelin events. He is highly adept in both and should be one of the leaders in the conference in those events.
