**Second Semester at N. U.
Finds Registration Boost**

An increased attendance at the College of Liberal Arts of Northwestern university is now indicated for the second semester, which started last Monday, registration day. At last reports new students applying for admission numbered 150, most of whom are to be freshmen. With the usual migration from university to university among upper classmen, the entire number of new students may go much higher. However, a goodly number of students are dropping out for one or another reason. This is said to be invariably true at this time of the year. There are always a small number of so-called "flunks" and also a few who drop out for personal reasons, such as illness or low finances. But the net increase in Liberal Arts is now expected to be as large as the facilities of the Evanston campus will permit, something over 2,200 students. This year, as has been true for several years of the Evanston departments, limitations of facilities largely controls the number of students who will be registered, provided credits are acceptable.
