### Arthur P. Rogers of City National Bank Takes Waukegan Post

Arthur P. Rogers, formerly of Wilmette, will terminate twenty-four years' service for the City National bank of Evanston March 1 in order to take a position as cashier of the Peoples' State Bank of Waukegan. He is first assistant cashier of the Evanston bank, having worked up from messenger boy and having served in every department.

Mr. Rogers explained that the opening in Waukegan was such that he could not afford to turn it down much as he regretted leaving Evanston and the local bank.

He entered the City National bank May 9, 1903. The bank had been organized but three years then. A native of Wilmette, he had lived there until seven years ago when he and his family moved to Evanston. Mr. Rogers plans to sell the home which they built a few years ago at 2041 Hawthorne lane.

Mrs. Rogers was Miss Ethel Wilson of Waukegan and it was partly because of her family connections there that Mr. Rogers was willing to make the change, when the death of the vice president of the Waukegan bank created a vacancy there. Mr. Rogers is secretary of the Evanston Civil service board.

### E. T. Leonard Company Sell Orchard Lane Home

Leonard company builders, 556 Center street, Winnetka, are rushing to completion the new English type house at 512 Orchard lane, Winnetka, which they report has been sold, for May 1 delivery.
