The Grand Ceremonial of Camp Fire will be held Saturday, May 7th in the Rudolph Matz hall of Community House.

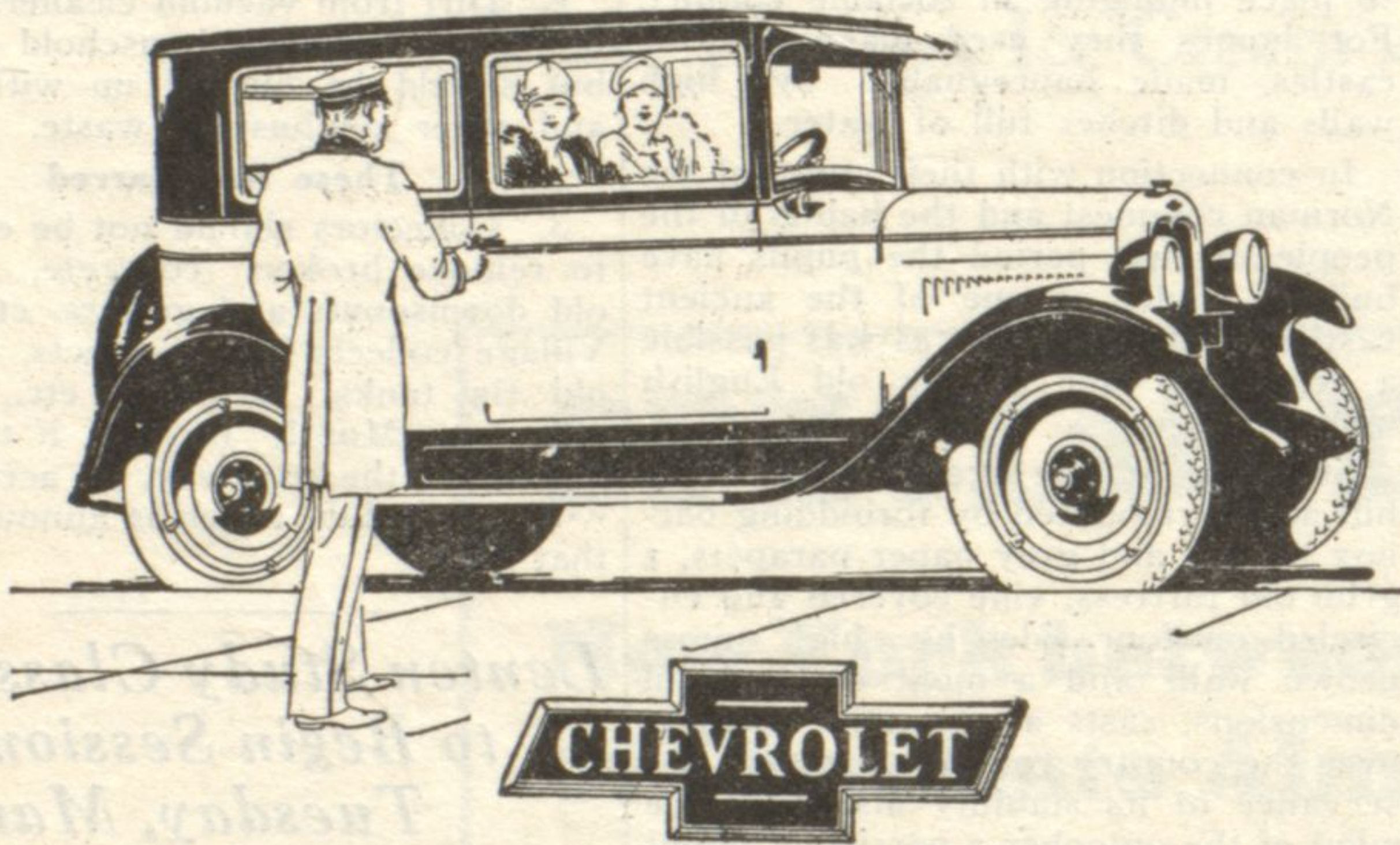
### Indoor Putting Honors Taken by Fred Richardson
