Firemen Extinguish Blaze at John Stuart Residence



Edward J. Meltzer Makes Arrangements to Give Instruction Here in Reed, Brass, Fretted Instruments

Edward J. Meltzer, who for the past two years has taught the study of wind instruments at the Skokie school and the North Shore Country Day school, has completed arrangements for his Winnetka studio in Community House, where he will teach the various instruments of the reed, brass, and fretted instrument groups. Mr. Meltzer brings to his teaching a thorough preparation, for he has traveled from coast to coast to hear the greatest bands and orchestras and to study with the foremost players of each instrument that he teaches. Students of the clarinet, saxophone, cornet, trumpet, trombone, French horn, and other brass instruments will no longer need to travel long distances to get instruction, for the methods of the greatest teachers will be brought to Winnetka by his teaching.

Herbert L. Clarke, for seventeen years the cornet soloist and assistant conductor of Sousa's band, Edward B. Llewellyn, the brilliant first trumpet of the Chicago Symphony orchestra, and A. Liberati, internationally famous cornet soloist, were his principal teachers on the cornet and trumpet. He studied trombone with F. H. Innes and Jaroslav Cimera, and French horn with Max Pottag of the Chicago Symphony. To gain a thorough knowledge of the clarinet and saxophone, Mr. Meltzer went to John A. Carney, formerly one of the first clarinetists of the Sousa band and Val Hendrichs of the Denver Symphony. Fretted instruments were studied with Alfredo Zuartullo, nationally famous teacher of the mandolin, banjo, and ukelele, and drums with George Robertson of the Chicago Civic orchestra.

Mr. Meltzer holds two degrees from Northwestern university, representing together eight years of college study. His Bachelor of Music degree was awarded for his studies on the trumpet with Edward Llewellyn, and his work in theory, harmony, and composition with Professors Oldberg, Lutkin, and Beecher. His Bachelor of Arts degree was won "cum laude" and the honor of election to the Phi Beta Kappa sorority.

Studies in piano and voice added to his general musicianship. He has been for six years a member of the Evanston Symphony orchestra and was for four years director of the Northwestern university band, resigning his position last year to found his own school for wind and fretted instruments, which has branches in Chicago and Evanston as well as in Winnetka.
