#### Nash Motor Plant Model in Its Modern Equipment

How inventive genius keeps pace with the ever-rising necessities of modern industry is reflected in much of the machinery with which the Nash the past ten years, it is said. Scores of human-like machines, totally unknown a few years ago, are today performing various operations in different departments of the Nash plant; they are performing these operations quicker and with a degree of consistent accuracy unattainable by hand.

One of the newest and most interesting automatic machines known to the industry is that in use at the Nash factory. It is an automatic honing machine which accomplishes at one time the final mirror-like finish on all seven main bearings and six connecting rod bearings. Formerly it was necessary to polish individually each of these thirteen bearings. But now the operation is performed on every bearing simultaneously and with scientific accuracy within a fractional part of a thousandth of an inch.
