

OPEN SEASON TICKET SALE FOR GRID GAMES

Northwestern University Alumni and Patrons Given First Chance at Choice Seats

Application blanks for the 1927 season football tickets were mailed this week to 52,000 alumni and grid patrons of Northwestern university. The unprecedented demand for season tickets has caused university authorities to offer the application blanks at this early date. It is planned to sell 20,000 of the season books.

Season tickets to next fall's games besides being one dollar cheaper than purchasing single tickets, give the holder the same seat at all six home games.

Home games to be played by the Purple next fall are: October 1, University of South Dakota; October 8, University of Utah; October 22, University of Illinois; October 29, University of Missouri; November 12, University of Indiana; November 19, University of Iowa.

Selection of Dick Hanley as Northwestern's new football leader has caused considerable interest to be manifested in the outlook for the Wildcats next fall. Coach Hanley's new style of football which he will bring into the conference has also been the cause for the desire of many to watch the 1927 edition of the Wildcats in action.

Coach Hanley will soon get underway with spring football drill in which he will start to develop his team into the type of football he hopes to use in sweeping through the conference

to a successful season next fall. He will be assisted at the start by Tim Lowry and Herb Steger, assistants under Thistlethwaite.

Dyche stadium next fall will accommodate 45,000 persons of which 8,000 will be for students and several thousand others for the use of visiting teams. This will leave 20,000 good seats available for season ticket orders.

Orders received early will be given a prior choice. A brisk demand is anticipated for the season booklets and those desiring the pick of the seats are urged to get in their orders at once. All orders for season tickets are to be addressed to the ticket manager's office at 619 Clark street, Evanston.
