

Cermak in his sessions on the Forest Preserve budget has insisted that vandalism, destruction of property and the carrying away of benches, etc., must stop, and one of the outstanding items of the budget is the creation of twenty-five motorcycle policemen, who will keep a constant vigilance over the property of the preserves protecting citizens and protecting property.

A war is expected to be waged on policemen of villages who follow automobilists into the preserves and attempt to exercise their village authority over automobilists who park in the preserves.

With the beginning of Lent comes the annual popularity of hot cross buns. With an ancestry thousands of years old, the bun starts this week to better its own last year's record. Thirteen thousand miles of hot cross buns -the two hundred fifty million would reach from pole to pole-were sold in the United States last year.

Centuries before the Christian era, the ancient Egyptians offered "bouns," bearing the mark of two horns, to their favorite moon goddesses. Later the Greeks offered them to their gods, changing the mark of the horns to a cross. The Saxons marked their buns with a cross in honor of Eostre (Easter), their goddess of Light; and so the historical bun went down the ages and was popularized long before the birth of Christ. Two petrified and perfectly shaped buns were discovered years ago at Herculaneum, the ancient city destroyed by an eruption of Mount Vesuvius.
