Three Residence Permits Total \$93,000 in Value

Building permits for three residences valued at \$93,000 were issued by the Village of Kenilworth during the month of February, according to a statement issued early this week. They are comprised of a house valued at \$12,000, to be built for O. P. Olson at 535 Ridge avenue; a house valued at \$30,000, to be erected for Stanley Knight at 51 Kenilworth avenue and a residence for T. Grant Cook at 355 Kenilworth avenue, valued at \$51,000.

Winnetka February Permits Totals Near \$140,000

Fifteen building permits were issued in Winnetka during the month of February, according to the report of A. B. Kreig, building inspector for the village. The total valuation of the improvements represented by the permits, is \$137,430. Seven permits were for new residences, valued at \$119,600; five were for accessories valued at \$1,830; two for alterations amounting to \$6,000 and one for a foundation costing \$10,000. The latter is for the new Schell apartment and business block on Elm street.

Permits Show Building Spurt Due in Glencoe

Ten building permits were issued in Glencoe during the month of February, the total amount of improvements represented being \$95,600. Six of the permits were for residences costing \$85,000; three were for alterations totaling \$10,100 and one was for a \$500 garage.

Wilmette Building Grants in February Approach \$165,000

Twenty-four building permits were issued in Wilmette during the month of February, an average of one each day, exclusive of Sundays. The amount of the improvements thus authorized is \$163,075. Twelve of the permits were for residences, valued at \$140,500. Ten were for garages, valued at \$20,775, included in this list being the permit issued during the last week in the month to James Crabb, for a public garage at 730 Twelfth street, costing \$18,000. There were also two permits for repairs, amounting to \$1,800.

The greatest activity during the month was shown in the last week, when, in addition to the permit issued to Mr. Crabb, for the public garage on Twelfth street, permits also were issued as follows:

One to Fred R. Quayle, for a frame garage at 38 Crescent place, costing \$250.

To J. J. Bleser, for an addition to his residence on Reinwald avenue, costing \$1,500.

One to Ed Avers, for a frame garage at 1614 Central avenue, costing \$300.

To E. G. Sieber, for a frame garage at 1118 Lake avenue, costing \$150.

One to Everett W. Proctor for a two-story, frame residence and garage at 1519 Central avenue, costing \$9,000.

To James Crabb for a brick veneer and shingle residence at 1707 Walnut avenue, to cost \$7,000.
