Kurenko Pleases in Season's Final Music Club Recital

The third season of Artist Recitals, sponsored by the Winnetka Music club, came to a close Tuesday, March 8, with a song recital by the Russian coloratura soprano, Maria Kurenko. She gave a widely varied program and sang it all with perfection of technic, though sometimes lacking in interpretation. She has a voice of great beauty and is unexcelled in her mastery of coloratura. She sings with style and elegance. While Madame Kurenko's voice has been modified, it still retains an exotic savor, and, like the voices of all Russian women, it trends towards sharpness at times. Her Russian group was given with great freedom and spontaneity, and in her French songs she was equally facile.

In the final group, "Time of Parting," by Hadley, and the familiar "Lass With the Delicate Air," seemed most pleasing. She was most gracious with encores and ended her program with a fascinating little song called "Rain." The composer's name was not available. Mr. MacDonald's accompaniments were good but showed a lack of practice in their ensemble.
