### New Trier Music Groups to Sing at States' Meet

During the week of spring vacation, early in April, a group of New Trier students will have the unusual opportunity of singing with a chorus of several hundred people. Many from the Glee clubs and a few from the band accompanied by Miss Winnifred Mickey, Miss Jones, and Mrs. Marion Cotton will go to Springfield to participate in a concert under the auspices of the North Central Music Supervisors' conference. The states of Michigan, Indiana, Wisconsin, Illinois, Iowa, both Dakotas, and Minnesota are to be represented. The Music department at New Trier has already begun work on the numbers which are to be rendered, not by the individual schools, but by the conference chorus and band. The music chosen is of the first caliber and includes a double chorus by Palestrina and works of present day composers.

Two hours of each day while at the conference will be devoted to rehearsal. The students will be entertained by the civic bodies of Springfield who are planning a cordial welcome for them.

The only expense of the trip will be railroad fare as the citizens of Springfield have generously agreed to open their homes to the young people attending the conference.

It is planned by the New Trier music department that some of the compositions to be sung in this conference will be used by the local organization in the Suburban High School Music Festival which will be held later in the spring.
